Gallery – Third Floor
Visual Story

The show you are seeing is being performed at Hackney Empire. This is the outside of the theatre. The arrow points to the way in.



This is the main entrance to the theatre. There is also lift access to all floors through this main entrance.



Here is the Box Office, where you may need to collect your tickets from. If you already have your tickets, you can walk past the Box Office and head to the side entrance (please see the next image). There may be a queue here as other people will be collecting their tickets. The person in this picture is a member of our Front of House staff, these are the people who look after the audience.



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Once you have collected your tickets, you will need to go to the side entrance of the theatre on Wilton Way. This is because your tickets are in the Gallery, which you cannot get to through the main entrance.



This is the entrance you will need to use to get to the Gallery. There are 89 steps to the Gallery.

If you are a wheelchair user, a member of our Front of House staff will be on hand to assist you with the lift.



There will be signs with arrows helping you find your way to the Gallery.

89 Steps



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This is the Gallery. It bends around like a semi-circle. As you may see in the picture, there is no back rest in the seats and these are unallocated, so feel free to sit where you prefer.



Refreshments can be bought from the bar which can be found at the back of the Gallery.



If you need to use the toilet during the production, then look out for our toilet signs which you can find on the walls of the auditorium.



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Before the show starts there will be an announcement asking you to find your seats. A member of our Front of House team will be available to help you. You must be seated before the show starts.



In the interval (a short break half way through the show) you can walk around the theatre and go to the toilet, the bar and back to the foyer if you wish. There will be an announcement when the show is about to start again, and the curtain will open again.

During the show, people may be loud or make sounds at the characters, and at the end of the show, lots of people in the audience may clap their hands. This means they enjoyed the show. You can clap as well if you feel like it. Once the clapping has finished, you can leave the theatre the way you came in.
